DAY 2: WHAT GOD IS LIKE

Read John 14:8–9 NIV

Have you ever wondered what God is like? Is He kind? Is He patient? Does He care about people who are left out? One day, Jesus' friends asked Him that same question. Jesus told them something amazing. When you look at Jesus, you are seeing what God is like. Jesus didn't just talk about God's Kingdom. He lived it.

Everywhere Jesus went, He showed God's Kingdom by loving people, helping the hurting, forgiving sins, and welcoming those others ignored. When Jesus showed compassion, that was God's Kingdom in action. When

Jesus healed, forgave, or invited people close, He was showing what life with God looks like. If you want to know how to live in God's Kingdom, look at Jesus. The more you learn from Him, the more you understand God's heart.

DAY 3: NO MATTER WHAT

Grab a sheet of paper, scissors, a pen or pencil, and an empty glass jar (or another container). Then find a few people who follow Jesus and ask them this question: What Bible verses bring you comfort when you're facing problems—verses that remind you God is always with you and God loves you no matter what?

Try to collect at least six or seven verses. If you don't get that many from your conversations, look up the verses below in a Bible and choose the ones that are most meaningful to you:

DAY 4: LOVING LIKE THE FATHER
Read Luke 15:28–32 NIrV

The older son was angry that his brother was forgiven. He felt like it wasn't fair. But the father reminded him that his love was always available. Sometimes we feel like the older son. We compare ourselves to others or think someone doesn't deserve forgiveness. But God invites us to love others the same way He loves us.

At-Home Activity: Talk with someone at home about a time forgiveness was hard. How can showing love help heal relationships?

DAY 5: EVERYONE IS WELCOME
Read Romans 8:38–39 NIrV

Sometimes we feel worried or afraid. We might wonder, "Does God still love me when I mess up? Does He love me when I'm scared or sad?" The Bible gives us a very clear answer: Yes! Romans 8:38-39 tells us that nothing can separate us from God's love. Not our mistakes. Not hard days. Not fear. Not the future. God's love is strong and never lets go. Because of Jesus, God's love is always with us. When we trust Jesus, we are safe in His love forever. That means we can be brave, hopeful, and confident, knowing that God will never leave us. No matter what happens, God's love stays the same. God's love is bigger than any mistake. Nothing can separate you from His love.

Journal: How does it make you feel knowing God wants everyone in His Kingdom?

Pray: "God, thank You for loving me no matter what. Help me accept Your love and share it with others, just like You do. In Jesus' name. Amen."
